- Bahrain: Abduljalil Al-Singace, Mechanical engineer (University of Bahrain).<sup>[1]</sup>
  - ▶ Jailed 2010-2011, then again since 2011 (life imprisonment).
  - ► Human rights and pro-democracy activism. Participated in the "Arab Spring" uprising.
  - ▶ On a fluids-only hunger strike since July 8, 2021, in protest of the confiscation of a manuscript he was writing. [2]



- China: Ilham Tohti, Economist (Minzu University, Beijing)<sup>[3]</sup>.
  - ▶ Jailed since 2014 (life imprisonment).
  - ▶ Uyghur scholar, researched social and economic issues in Xinjiang. [4]
  - ▶ Tried secretly over 2 days.



- Iran: Ahmadrezza Djalali, Medical researcher (Karolinska Institute, Sweden)<sup>[5]</sup>.
  - ▶ Jailed since 2016 (death sentence).
  - ▶ Was reportedly asked to use his position to spy on behalf of Iran, he refused. [6]
  - ▶ Unfair trial: denied right to appeal, forced confession, torture.



- China: Rahile Dawut, Ethnographer (University of Xinjiang). [7]
  - ▶ Arrested in 2017, secretly tried in 2018, sentenced to life.
  - ▶ Her career focused on documenting Uyghur folklore and traditions.
  - ▶ She was held incommunicado until her sentence was revealed in 2023.



- Russia: Azat Miftakhov, Mathematician (Moscow State University). [8]
  - ▶ Arrested in 2019 on hooliganism charges, sentenced to 6 years.
  - ► Irregularities at trial: unreliable witnesses, confessions under torture, lack of evidence.
  - ▶ Released in September 2023, and immediately re-arrested. Sentenced in March 2024 to a further 4 years for "justifying terrorism". [9]







- Russia: Researchers on hypersonic flight<sup>[10]</sup>
  - ▶ In Prison: Anatoly Maslov (2022-)<sup>[11]</sup>, Alexandr Shiplyuk (2022-)<sup>[11]</sup>, Alexandr Kuranov (2021-)<sup>[12]</sup>, Anatoly Gubanov (2020-)<sup>[13]</sup>
  - ▶ Waiting trial: Vladislav Galkin (2023-)<sup>[10]</sup>, Valery Golubkin (2021-)<sup>[14]</sup>
  - ▶ Died in custody: Viktor Kudryavtsev (2018-2021)<sup>[15]</sup>, Dmitry Kolker (2022)<sup>[10]</sup>, Roman Kovalyov (2018-2022)<sup>[16]</sup>
  - ▶ Released: Vladimir Lapygin  $(2016-2020)^{[17]}$
  - ► House arrest: Valery Zvegintsev (2022-)<sup>[11]</sup>







- China: Chinese professors working in Japan
  - ► Fan Yuntao<sup>[18]</sup>, Political Scientist, disappeared in 2024.
  - ▶ Hu Shiyun<sup>[19]</sup>, Language teacher, disappeared in 2023.
  - ► Yuan Kegin<sup>[20]</sup> Political Scientist sentenced to 6 years in 2020 on espionage charges.

### Released



- Iran: Niloufar Bayani, Biologist (Persian Wildlife Heritage Foundation)<sup>[21]</sup>
  - ► Arrested doing fieldwork with 8 other scientists. [22]
  - ▶ Jailed from 2018 to 2024 (10 year sentence).
  - ▶ Pardoned on April 8, 2024.
  - ▶ Reported sexual and psychological harassment in prison. [23]

### Governments controlling academic activity

- China: Comprehensive push to enforce an ideological bias in universities. [24][25]
  - ▶ 2023: "Patriotic Education Law" [26] that restricts how the history and ideology of modern China should be taught.
  - ▶ 2023: Ministry of Education released plans to establish an "Ideology and Politics Index" that ranks universities according to their promotion of political and ideological education.
  - ▶ Hong Kong universities instructed to promote "love" for China. [27]
- USA: multiple state laws banning discussions of race, gender or sexuality, including book bans. [25] For instance the StopWOKE act in Florida.

### Governments controlling academic activity

- Nicaragua: government closed 6 universities in 2018 in connection with student protests. In 2023, it closed 3 more universities linked to the Catholic Church. One of these, the Central American University in Managua (UCA) was re-opened with a different leadership and a different name. [25]
- Russia: Moscow free university labeled as "Undesirable" and forced to close. [25]

### Scholars caught up in political upheaval

- Israeli-Palestinian conflict ( $\geq$  96 professors killed<sup>[28][29]</sup>, 12 universities damaged or destroyed<sup>[30]</sup>).
- Sudanese civil war.
- Taliban takeover of Afghanistan.
- Russian invasion of Ukraine ( $\geq 9$  universities destroyed, 59 damaged<sup>[31]</sup>).
- February 2021 coup in Myanmar, followed by repression and arrests.
- Mass incarceration of Uyghurs in Xinjiang, China starting in 2017.
- Failed 2015 coup in Türkiye (firings, arrests and travel bans en masse).
- Yemen civil war.

### Scholar Rescue Fund





- Awards fellowships to at-risk Scholars. They are 1 to 2 years long. SRF provides up to \$25 000 a year, and requires a matching donation from the host institution.
- So far, 1,807 awards have been granted to 1,122 scholars.
